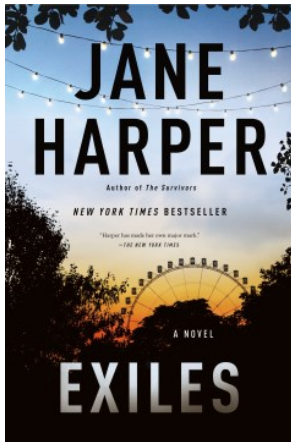

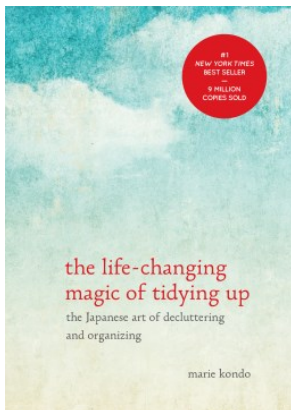


#### *I want to be a vase*

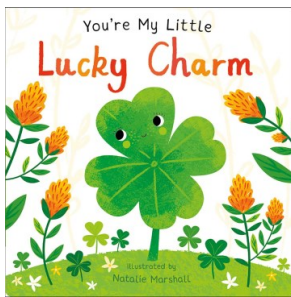
#### *The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying Up: The Japanese Art of Decluttering and Organizing*

by Nicola Edwards

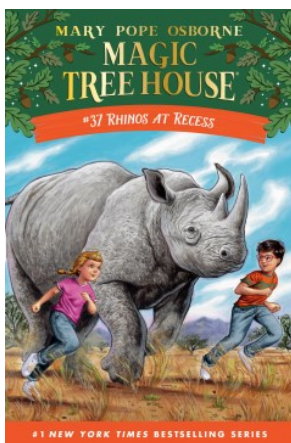

by Grace Lin

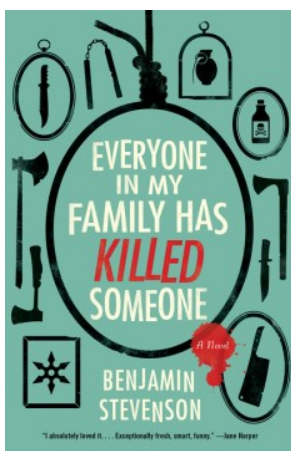
Celebrating the joy of reading and the power of imagination, this enchanting story follows Alice as she is swept away to a world of wonder and adventure in the pages of her favorite book.

by Mary Pope Osborne

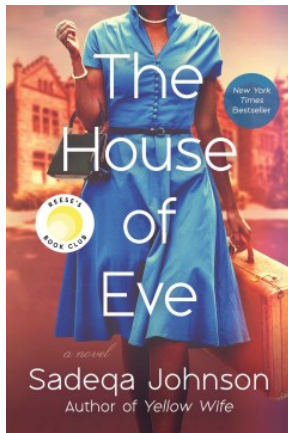
The magic tree house transports Jack and Annie to South Africa where they must protect a majestic rhino from poachers.

by Benjamin Stevenson

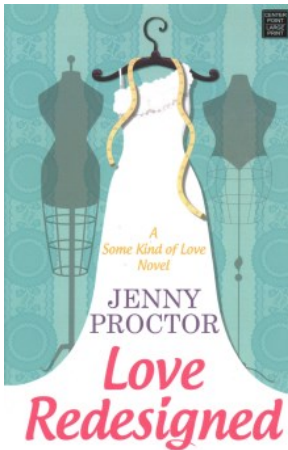
A self-published author of crime novel writing guides attends a reunion with his family of expert killers and investigates when a body is found outside in the snow as another storm approaches.

by Sadeqa Johnson

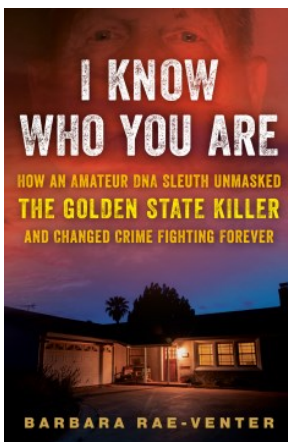
